Eight blank tags for ordinary paper. Write a stable ID, cut on the borders, and keep the matching register. Not a branded adhesive-label template.

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Protect paper from weather. Check label ties as stems expand; do not allow a tie to constrict growth. Write Unknown rather than guessing a cultivar or rootstock.

Label identity register

Keep this page indoors as a backup. Use the same tree / graft ID on the tag, storage batch, aftercare sheet and orchard map.

Uncertain identities or missing source records to resolve

Keep the nursery label or source message. A matching name is a record of identity supplied, not independent authentication.

One tree can carry several grafts. Sketch the trunk and branches, number each graft position, then connect each ID to its cultivar and source.
